## Dubai's Dh47.3b budget has eye on Expo 2020

DUBAI — Dubai unveiled on Wednesday a Dh47.3 billion innovation-oriented budget for 2017 that will also see a 27 per cent surge in infrastructure spending as well as the creation of 3,500 jobs.

His Highness Shaikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice-President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, approved the budget that allocates 34 per cent of the total spending for the social development sector, including health, education, housing and community development, and 17 per cent for infrastructure as the country steps up efforts for Expo 2020 Dubai.
